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

SUPPORT: RED DE APOYO A PAPÁS DE PREMATUROS



Out of Danny Schwank's personal experience, Red de Apoyo a Papás de Prematuros (RAPP) was born. "In our 35-day journey with our 32-week preemie, Lukas, we experienced fear, love, hope, sadness all in a single day. During that time, we made friends, cried with them and shared each other's happiness. From that experience another mother, Paola Cofiño, and I started to think, 'How we can do more to help others in our situation?'"

Building Red de Apoyo a Papás de Prematuros (RAPP). "2017 was our planning year and in the meantime, we were supporting other families from our NICU," notes Schwank. "In 2018 we started our Facebook page RAPP (Red de Apoyo a Papás de Prematuros). Currently, we are providing the utmost support in our private hospitals and extending our knowledge and resources with parents from public hospitals as well. In 2018 we supported more than 29 families! We have a small mentoring group of 7 mothers and 2 fathers, but we are always searching for more families and information to prepare ourselves better to support whomever needs us."

Support In Person But Also Online. The group goes beyond in-person support to helping others virtually through RAPP's social media channels, as well as having private one-on-one conversations if families prefer it. "We have a Facebook and Instagram page where we post related information, terminology and articles. We also post a highlighted preemie story every 15 days.

Coming Up. Says Schwank, "For 2019 we are fundraising to give away NICU packages that will include hand sanitizer, cream, some snacks, a notepad and pen."

"The Newborn Foundation was launched after the co-founder's baby, Eve, was diagnosed with a critical congenital heart defect at two days old," comments team member Maclaren Johnson. "Eve was able to survive because of early detection in the hospital and access to life-saving treatment. Now, because of Eve, all 4 million newborns in the U.S. are being screened with pulse oximetry."

Johnson continues, "Newborns with a congenital heart defect can appear healthy at first, the pulse oximeter screening can identify heart abnormalities before any signs are shown. The noninvasive pulse oximeter uses a "little red beam of light" to read both the amount of oxygen in the blood and pulse rate. And the pulse oximeter sensor is placed on the newborn's toe and then provides a reading that indicates if the newborn passes or fails the screening test."

The Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), is a great equalizer for all preemie parents that endure it. Regardless of gestational age at birth, a preemie parent is a preemie parent. They all work through many of the same exact emotions and worries. They fear their baby might not make it. They also fear that the bond with their baby is broken while they wait days, weeks, and even months before that first hold.

No one understands this pain like that of the medical team members surrounding the families, especially those in the nursing spectrum. Enter *Small But Mighty* author **Alyssa Veech, NNP**, a Neonatal Nurse Practitioner from at Sisters of Charity Hospital and faculty member at the University of Buffalo. Her passion for families in the NICU is evident with every word of this book.

Traveling through the preemie journey in the NICU, Veech lovingly brings us through the moment by moment stay of the NICU all the way into discharge. With words that gently speak of the challenges of tiny babies, she also uplifts them as strong fighters. And with a very diverse set of parents illustrated throughout the book, every preemie parent in the NICU will read these words aloud with pride. This book should be on the baby registry list for all preemie parents and a shoe-in buy by all grandparents.

ALL OF THAT PAPERWORK

You get home and breathe a sigh of relief. No more hospital visits, no more running back and forth -yay! But wait - oh no, lots of follow-up appointments and yeesh - paperwork! What do you to tame that paperwork? Some tips:

- Either buy a binder or a set of folders (new or used, doesn't matter) as your organizer.
- ☑ Divide the binder and/or label the folders into sections such as NICU, Insurance, Pediatrician, Cardiologist, etc.
- When you get paperwork, put it in where it should live and at the top so you have most current info on top.
- Make sure all notes from the doctors, therapists, etc. go into this for safe-keeping.
- ☑ Put this organizer in a safe place away from prying eyes and little hands.
