April is Autism Awareness Month. Let's talk statistics. According to Spectrum: "About 7 percent of children born preterm are autistic, compared with 1 to 2 percent of children in the general population."

Prematurity can cause problems for babies throughout their lives - long-term intellectual and developmental disabilities and problems with lungs, brain, eyes and other organs.

Crystal Ball Health is working to create a preemie registry that will power the research to provide better patient outcomes – in the NICU through the adult years with the hope to help former premature babies answer questions about their early births and inform their care long after they've left the NICU.

AFTER THE NICU

Babies born before 37 weeks of pregnancy may be more likely to show signs or symptoms of autism than other babies. Are you years out of the NICU and now have a child with an Autism diagnosis? You are not alone. Here are a few suggestions for helping you and your child thrive:

- Don't wait for a diagnosis. Seek help as soon as you suspect something's wrong. Don't wait to see if your child will catch up later or outgrow the problem. Early intervention is the most effective way to speed up your child's development and reduce the symptoms of autism over the lifespan.
- Become an expert on your child. Educate yourself and reach out to professionals with experience. Learning all you can about autism and getting involved in treatment will go a long way toward helping your child.
